### Sixth Form at Castle Rushen High School

We are delighted that you want to continue your studies into Sixth Form at Castle Rushen High School and look forward to working together over the next 2 years after a disrupted Year 11 and Summer Exams Season.

Please come to Signing on Day, which is from 1000 – 1300 on Friday 21 August. Please bring along:

- 1. Your sixth form subject choices form, completed as far as possible
- 2. The completed Form D, in respect of routine school trips during normal school hours
- 3. The completed Form C, in respect specifically of the Venture Centre trip on Friday 11 September
- 4. The completed data entry form, so we can update our systems

Below are some key points about taking school seriously. It is important that you agree to:

- Attend school, on Mondays Fridays from 9.00am until 3.45pm during term time. It is quite possible to arrive earlier and/or leave later, studying in the Sixth Form Centre.
- Attend and participate actively and appropriately in tutor time, assemblies, learning for life, enrichment and private study sessions as well as your subject lessons.
- Follow the Sixth Form Dress Code which ensures cohesion and consistency in our sixth form.

In the event of failures in the above, we will discuss these with you and agree required next steps for improvement. If these do not take place, we will contact parents/carers. If there is still no improvement there is the potential that you will be asked to leave school.

To make your time with us a success, you need to study diligently, properly undertake all work set, and perform well academically. We will undertake regular assessments. Students who are underperforming significantly and/or exhibiting a poor attitude to learning may ultimately be required to leave school. If you obtain a U grade (fail grade) in your end of Year 12 mock exam for a subject, and/or it is estimated by our staff that you will obtain a U grade at the end of Year 13, it is highly likely that you will be unable to continue that subject into Year 13. We will discuss this with you and try to help. However you may ultimately be required to leave school if your chances of academic success are low. Students resitting English Language or Mathematics at GCSE will be expected to obtain at least a C grade during Year 12 in order to proceed to Year 13 studies.

You will act as a good role model for younger students in school and your peers, and behave properly when in our school, local and Island community. Causing disruption to others is not tolerated in Sixth Form.

Holidays during term time can be approved by the Headteacher. We strongly recommend that you avoid these wherever possible since they negatively affect your academic prospects. Holidays will not normally be approved in respect of students with poor attendance or poor academic performance.

Sixth Form is all about your development as an independent learner. It is important to approach your tutor, or the Head of Sixth Form, proactively, in the event of any problems. We are here to help. It's a great time where there's plenty of fun too!

### Signing on for Sixth Form

Signing on for Sixth Form Day is Friday 21 August, from 1000 – 1300. You should attend school during that time, unless you have agreed alternative arrangements.

## To join Sixth Form you need:

- 5 or more A\* C at GCSE (or Level 2 equivalents) including English Language and Mathematics; and
- The right skills and behaviours to succeed at post-16 study

Conditional Entry to sixth form may still be possible, with limited subjects/choices and/or GCSE resit requirements, if:

- You have 4 or more A\*- C at GCSE (or Level 2 equivalents) including English Language or Mathematics (or both); or
- There are exceptional circumstances

### The Pathways are:

University Skills – for students expecting to carry on from Sixth Form into Higher Education (or those who aren't sure)

Work Skills – for students who are confident that they will want to go to Work when they leave Sixth Form

Russell – for students who are aiming for AAA or higher at A Level and intend applying for highly competitive courses

<sup>\* -</sup> **Health & Social Care Diploma** is the 2 A Level equivalent course, resulting in 2 grades. It is only available to students choosing Health & Social Care in Block A. **Further Maths** is only available to students choosing Mathematics in Block C and will be taught via distance learning from Ramsey Grammar School (RGS) plus some tutorial support at CRHS.

We suggest that students should not take both Business and Economics and that students should not take more than one subject with lessons away from CRHS, which are marked \*\* and \*\*\* in the table.

## Making final choices:

You can only choose one subject per block. Students may start with 4 subjects and drop down to 3 subjects within a few weeks, or simply start with the 3 subjects which they wish to take.

You should make subject choices having considered:

- 1. What you might wish to do after Year 13 and how best to prepare for that
- 2. Where your subject interests and strengths lie
- 3. Your skills, how you like to learn/study, and how well these match the way the course is assessed

The staff members available on signing on day will be able to help you finalise your choices. **Some subjects have specific minimum GCSE grade requirements** which are set out in the Options booklet referenced above. You should also consider carefully the impact of your combination of subjects and how you will succeed at studying them together.
