

Subject	Comments
Geography	Students have had a revision list from Miss Metcalfe and should be working their way through that, as well as revising their case studies. Students need to ensure that they revise the key terms, processes and case studies in preparation for the summer examinations. Practice of examination papers is key in terms of revision. These can be accessed from the Cambridge website or via Miss Metcalfe. Drop in sessions on Wednesday lunchtimes are available for Year 13 students in H6.
History	Mrs Williams is revising Unit 1: Wars of the Roses and Unit 2: America in the 1800s in her lessons. Ms Duff is revising Unit 3: China in her lessons. Both will be covering key topic areas and practicing examination questions.
Mathematics	The Maths course has been completed. All lessons are now dedicated to revision with all students still required to attend. If students want any extra sessions they can always come and see Mr Brookes or Mr Danielson and they will go through topics with them. Certain students already attend additional sessions with Mr Danielson after school on Mondays and on Thursday lunchtimes. All students will be given a revision pack of past papers and further past papers can be accessed on It's Learning.
Music	No specific revision plans are required as there is no Music exam this year. Students are working on coursework.
Performing Arts	No specific revision plans are required as there is no Performing Arts exam this year. Students are working on coursework.
PE	During the final few months of exam preparation, pupils will be given the opportunity to revisit areas that they feel need further development. Once a sound understanding of course content has been achieved, pupils will then focus on applying and evaluating this knowledge in line with the specification requirements. Additionally, pupils are offered a revision session on a Thursday morning from 8am - 8:45am alongside a coursework support session on Tuesday lunchtime from 1pm-1:30pm. Attendance at the morning sessions is highly recommended. We also continue to encourage students to access G-Docs, MyPeExam and Mr Caldwell's revision notes to further support their learning.
Physics	Revision resources for Yr13 Physics can be found on the It's Learning page entitled 'CRHS A Level Physics'. These include: a revision calendar, links to past papers and mark schemes and a guide to the three exam papers. Revision sessions for our Yr13 physicists take place on Wednesday lunchtimes at 1.20pm.
Product Design	Year 13 D&T students will have lesson time up to Friday 9 th March to work on their coursework. They will then have until Thursday 29 th March to submit their final projects. On Monday 12 th March the focus in lessons will switch to exam preparation.
Psychology	The course content will be completed by Easter, and lessons after this will involve active and challenging revision activities and exam preparation.
Textiles	Students are able to come to get additional help or guidance in DT3 and DT4 in their free periods, lunchtimes and after school each night. They are welcome to pop in anytime.

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Art	<p>A-Level Art studio spaces are open from 8am – 6pm every day. Staff are available to support after school on Monday – Thursday until 5pm.</p> <p>We are hoping to have some revision sessions organised in the first week of Easter – dates TBA</p>
Biology	<p>Students have had their revision programme issued. They have had a large number of sets of exam questions and quick questions, both paper copies and via Gmail. One lesson each week is put aside for revision and students have Mrs Holmes' timetable so know when she is available for lunch time and non-contact drops ins.</p>
Business	<p>Students have been issued with revision guides which they should read through. There are numerous revision materials and past papers shared with them on Google Drive.</p>
Chemistry	<p>Revision timetables have been prepared and links to past papers provided. Mrs Winstanley will provide further support upon her return to work.</p> <p>A calculations revision session may be offered during the Easter holidays, depending on needs as assessed nearer the time.</p>
Computing	<p>Miss Darbyshire is doing revision sessions with CRHS students at CRHS on Wednesday 4pm-5pm. This is expected to continue until they go on study leave.</p> <p>Miss Darbyshire also intends to offer some programming sessions in the afternoons of practice week and/or for a whole day during TT week.</p>
Creative Writing	<p>It is important that students attend all lessons. We are currently working through past-papers, and doing timed essays so it is imperative that students not only attend but arrive on time too.</p> <p>To further enhance their writing style it is important that students continue to read widely and keep their reading journal (with their personal reflections /observations made on the writing style of the author and its impact) up to date.</p>
Economics	<p>Students have been issued with revision guides which they should read through. There are numerous revision materials and past papers shared with them on Google Drive.</p>
English Literature	<p>Students have finished the course and are already working on revision tasks in lessons. It is important that they have the opportunity to consider and plan possible examination questions on each text and then have a go at the essay under timed conditions. Their teachers will provide an array of materials, including past papers and then mark the practice essays. Students will be encouraged to do this from now until their examinations, with the focus on constructive, quality feedback. Students should, of course revise the actual texts themselves. Students must attend lessons up until 'study leave', then feel free to practice their essay writing skills and hand these in for marking, knowing that their work will be marked and returned as soon as possible.</p>
French	<p>Students have been given a booklet of translations and reading exercises to work through. They will also be given a series of past essay titles which they are encouraged to plan/ write and submit for feedback. They should revise using the already prepared and marked essay titles in their Google drives. Grammar can be practiced using the grammar books supplied at the start of the year. There will be the opportunity for an Easter drop in session at the same time as the GCSE revision sessions, times and days TBA.</p>
